2021 First Place 4-H Report Essays

“Tell 2-3 highlights of your past year in 4-H. Why was each highlight important to you?”

1st Place Junior Essay: Emily Salisbury, age 10, Oakwood SRO 4-H Club

This year in 4-H has been so much fun. It has taught me so many cool and amazing things. For example, a project that I did last year was about cake decorating. I have always wanted to be a cake decorator. My dream is to someday open a bakery. The cake decorating project introduced me to new techniques, and styles of cakes. The book challenged me to practice techniques and make beautiful cakes. I never knew I could make such amazing cakes. The handbook also teaches you how to do the basics, so if you are a beginner, it's easy to follow along. I have learned so much from the project and I can't wait to learn more! In one of my 4-H meetings, we learned how to quilt. The idea was that once everyone finished sewing their quilt squares, we would sew them all together and donate a big quilt to the 4-H auction. One of the group members is very good at quilting, so she led us through the steps. Everyone's quilt squares looked so good in the end, and we learned how to use a sewing machine. This opportunity made me very inspired, so when I got home, I made a purse on my own. I also found extra patterned squares at home and so I sewed them together for another quilt. I love 4-H meetings, and without that meeting, I probably never would have known that I could quilt.

1st Place Senior Essay: Braydon Moore, age 17, BARN 4-H Club

When I started my journey in 4-H, I was young and unsure of how to handle animals, not comfortable speaking in front of others and was pretty shy. Through the years I have been in 4-H, I have become not only comfortable in handling animal projects, but also very knowledgeable in rabbit breeds, colors, species, specific traits, diseases, how to treat diseases and body composition. I have also become knowledgeable on these topics in poultry. One highlight in the past year was attending fair. We have lived in times that we are in school, out of school, near our friends and kept away. It has been very difficult. Being able to participate in something I know as “normal” was very positive for not only me, but for my fair family as well. Another highlight for the year was attending 4-H camp. The value that being with others, away from home, learning new things is not comparable. Camp brings out the best in kids and give the 4-H youth so many opportunities to make new friendships, try new things and to be comfortable being yourself. Through the experiences of showing animals, I have become more comfortable speaking in public, interacting with others on a more professional level and positive sportsmanship attributes. I have taken this comfort and used it to help others in my club who are new and other young 4-H members so that they can gain the same experience. This is very important to me.
