2019 First Place 4-H Report Essays

What are two (2) things that you think most kids DO NOT KNOW about 4-H? Tell how you would go about letting kids know about those things.

George Giese, 4-Winds, Age 8-13

I believe most people think that 4-H is just livestock and farming, but it is not! 4-H is much more. There are lots and lots of projects to take, to name a few: there is sewing, cooking, fishing, and basically anything you can think of. You can even take a self-determined project, if you can't find what you need to learn about in the regular projects. 4-H is for any kid no matter where they live.

4-h also includes shooting sports. I think the majority of the people don't even know that there is such a thing as 4-H Shooting Sports. There are many disciplines that you can take like shotgun, rifle, pistol and archery. You learn gun safety and you learn to shoot. I take rifle and pistol and my sister takes shotgun, I think shooting is fun and there are kids out there who would like it too. Maybe we could reach out to "scouting" type of organizations to give presentations at their meetings.

4-H is a good way to pursue your interests, it is good hands on learning, it helps you to learn new things in a fun and easy way. I think 4-H should run ads telling people this on the local television stations promoting non-livestock projects, so the public will learn that there is more to 4-H than just the farm.

Two things don't know about 4-H: Non livestock projects and the Jr. Fair Board.

Many kids outside of and even in 4-H do not know that there are non-livestock projects, as a result, people don't want animals or can't have them don't think 4-H is an option. I think a good way to make people aware that there are projects such as sewing, woodworking, cooking, etc. is that we could hold something like demonstrations or workshop activities at the fair or other events to let kids try something that 4-H offers. Maybe even a project showcase event or open house for the cloverbuds that is also open to the public, we could have older 4-H members bring in their projects to show and answer questions about their project.

Another thing kids in 4-H don't know about is the Jr. Fair Board. Before I applied, I didn't even know what they did. Only through getting on the Board did I learn what it is and what they do. I think it's hard to get kids to apply for it because nobody knows what we do. Maybe making a poster about what the Jr. Fair Board is and does for displaying at events like the county medal awards, County Judging, the fair or the 4-H Auction to enlighten the people about what they do.

I think people just don't know that 4-H is more than raising livestock. Showing people the pother options will get more people involved.
