

2020 Montgomery County, OH, 4-H Goat Scholarship

Background and Purpose

This \$1,000.00 scholarship fund was established in 2009 by long-time supporters of the Montgomery County Fair. The intent of this scholarship is to recognize outstanding current and/or former 4-H members who have excelled in and because of 4-H goat projects. The applicant may study any field at an accredited college or university.

Selection Procedures

Applicant's must be a current Ohio 4-H member and a senior in high school; or a current or former Ohio 4-H member and an undergraduate student 21 years or less. The applicant must be enrolled at an accredited college or university for the fall term. The applicant must have exhibited their goats at the Montgomery County Fair at least three years. One scholarship winner will be selected each year. Once awarded, winners may not re-apply.

This scholarship shall be the responsibility of the Montgomery County 4-H Goat Superintendents. Judges will be anonymous and applicants will be anonymous to the judges. Applications will have names removed from their application and a number assigned.

- 1. One letter of recommendation
- 2. Official copy of high school transcript or college transcript if undergraduate
- 3. Show at least three years of participation in the Mont. Co. Goat Project: i.e. placings each year, animals raised, lessons learned, etc.
- 4. Application form, complete all items on the application
- 5. Essay Detail how the 4-H goat project has made a positive impact on you and your family or as a result of this project, how you have been able to positivity impact the lives of others.

Criteria for selection

40 % of total 100% will be work in the 4-H goat projects 30% will be work in other 4-H projects, leadership and citizenship areas 10% will be academic performance 10% will be an essay 10% will be your need for the scholarship
